Sort order for levels:

- Allow users to preview rubric used in the module (otherwise rubric will only become visible after grading)
- Display rubric description during evaluation

- Allow grader to add text remarks for each criterion
- Show remarks to those being graded

33. However, if you have not set your lowest level to zero, an **error message** appears; it is recommended that the lowest score should be zero. However, it is possible to have a low score of 1 depending on your scale. With a passing expectation of 70%, if the scale is 1,2,3,4 then a score of 3 would credit learners with a pass at 75%. With a scale of 0 1 2 3, learners would not achieve a pass at 66%.

Warning: The minimum possible score for this rubric is not 0; this can result in unexpected grades for the activity. To avoid this, each criterion should have a level with 0 points.
This warning may be ignored if a scale is used for grading, and the minimum levels in the rubric correspond to the minimum value of the scale.
